#### HYBRID MEETING PROCESS

- a) <u>Commission Quorum:</u> State law indicates that a quorum must consist of Commissioners in person pursuant to AB 2449.
- b) <u>Public Comments:</u> For those wishing to make public comments remotely, identified individuals will be given up to three (3) minutes to speak. Staff will inform the individual when one minute is left and when their time is up. For those attending the meeting remotely, please click on the "Raise Hand" button under the "Reactions Tab" to raise your hand. For those joining via conference call, pressing \*9 will raise your hand. The three (3) minute limit also applies to virtual public comments.
- c) Accommodations for Persons with Disabilities: Santa Cruz LAFCO does not discriminate on the basis of disability, and no person shall, by reason of a disability, be denied the benefits of its services, programs, or activities. # 3. ADOPTION OF MINUTES

The Commission will consider approving the minutes from the June 4, 2025 Regular LAFCO Meeting.

Recommended Action: Approve the minutes as presented with any desired changes.

#### 4. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

This is an opportunity for members of the public to address the Commission on items not on the agenda, provided that the subject matter is within the jurisdiction of the Commission and that no action may be taken on an off-agenda item(s) unless authorized by law.

#### 5. PUBLIC HEARINGS

Public hearing items require expanded public notification per provisions in State law, directives of the Commission, or are those voluntarily placed by the Executive Officer to facilitate broader discussion.

# a. Service & Sphere Review for the Resource Conservation District

The Commission will consider the adoption of a service and sphere review for the only resource conservation district in Santa Cruz County.

## Recommended Actions:

- 1) Find, pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the State CEQA Guidelines, that LAFCO determined that the service and sphere of influence review is not subject to the environmental impact evaluation process because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment and the activity is not subject to CEQA;
- Determine, pursuant to Government Code Section 56425, that LAFCO is required to develop and determine a sphere of influence for the Resource Conservation District of Santa Cruz County, and review and update, as necessary;
- 3) Determine, pursuant to Government Code Section 56430, that LAFCO is required to conduct a service review before, or in conjunction with an action to establish or update a sphere of influence; and
- 4) Adopt the resolution (LAFCO No. 2025-09) approving the 2025 Service and Sphere Review for the Resource Conservation District of Santa Cruz County, with the following terms and conditions:

- a. Reaffirm the District's current sphere of influence;
- b. Update the District's website to fulfill the statutory requirements under Senate Bill 929 no later than August 31, 2026 and provide a status update to the Commission on the District's website no later than September 2, 2026; and
- c. Direct the Executive Officer to distribute a copy of the adopted service and sphere review to the Resource Conservation District for their records and to include on their website.

#### 6. OTHER BUSINESS

Other business items involve administrative, budgetary, legislative, or personnel matters and may or may not be subject to public hearings.

# a. Felton Fire Protection District Governance Options Report

The Commission will receive an update on the analysis of possible governance options developed by LAFCO for the Felton Fire Protection District.

### Recommended Actions:

- 1) Receive and file the Felton FPD Governance Options Report; and
- 2) Direct staff to continue working with the Felton Fire Protection District and provide periodic updates, when warranted.

# b. Pajaro Valley Fire Protection District Fee Waiver Request

The Commission will consider the request from the Pajaro Valley Fire Protection District (PVFPD) to waive the application fees regarding the proposed reorganization between PVFPD and County Service Area 48 (CSA 48).

#### Recommended Actions:

- 1) Approve a full fee waiver (\$8,000);
- 2) Approve a fee reduction based on Commission discussion; or
- 3) Deny fee waiver

#### c. CALAFCO Update

The Commission will receive an update on the status of the California Association of Local Agency Formation Commission (CALAFCO), discuss this year's annual conference, and designate a voting delegate for the upcoming CALAFCO Board of Directors election process.

#### Recommended Actions:

- 1) Designate a Voting Delegate for the upcoming election;
- 2) Approve the nomination of Roger Anderson for the public member seat on the CALAFCO Board of Directors; and
- Approve the proposed nominations for the Outstanding CALAFCO Volunteer Award and the Outstanding LAFCO Professional Award

# d. Special District Risk Management Authority Election Process

The Commission will consider electing up to four candidates for the upcoming vacancies on the SDRMA Board of Directors.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> Identify any candidate the commission supports and direct staff to vote on behalf of Santa Cruz LAFCO.

# e. LAFCO Meeting Relocation

The Commission will consider relocating two future LAFCO meetings due to a rescheduled remodeling project in the County Board of Supervisors Chambers in October and November.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> Relocate LAFCO's October and November Meetings to a new location within Santa Cruz County.

# f. Legislative Update

The Commission will receive a status update on the new legislative session and legislative-related activities of LAFCO interest.

Recommended Action: No action required; Informational item only.

# g. Comprehensive Quarterly Report – Fourth Quarter (FY 2024-25)

The Commission will receive an update on active proposals, the Commission's work program and adopted budget, recent and upcoming meetings, and other staff activities.

Recommended Action: No action required; Informational item only.

#### 7. WRITTEN CORRESPONDENCE

LAFCO staff receive written correspondence and other materials on occasion that may or may not be related to a specific agenda item. #### Campaign Contributions

State law (Government Code Section 84308) requires that a LAFCO Commissioner disqualify themselves from voting on an application involving an "entitlement for use" (such as an annexation or sphere amendment) if, within the last twelve months, the Commissioner has received \$500 or more in campaign contributions from an applicant, any financially interested person who actively supports or opposes an application, or an agency (such as an attorney, engineer, or planning consultant) representing an applicant or interested participant. The law also requires any applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding. The Commission prefers that the disclosure be made on a standard form that is filed with LAFCO staff at least 24 hours before the LAFCO hearing begins. If this is not possible, a written or oral disclosure can be made at the beginning of the hearing. The law also prohibits an applicant or other participant from making a contribution of \$500 or more to a LAFCO Commissioner while a proceeding is pending or for 3 months afterward. #### Contributions and Expenditures Supporting and Opposing Proposals

Pursuant to Government Code Sections §56100.1, §56300(b), §56700.1, §59009, and §81000 et seq., and Santa Cruz LAFCO's Policies and Procedures for the Disclosures of Contributions and Expenditures in Support of and Opposition to proposals, any person or combination of persons who directly or indirectly contributes a total of \$1,000 or more or expends a total of \$1,000 or more in support of or opposition to a LAFCO Proposal must comply with the disclosure requirements of the Political Reform Act (Section 84250). These requirements contain provisions for making disclosures of contributions and expenditures at specified intervals.
